Going Green at the Bermuda Championship New PGA TOUR reusable cup policy; tournament remains as scheduled for fall

SOUTHAMPTON, Bermuda (April 22, 2020) – To celebrate Earth Day, the Bermuda Championship is pleased to share the PGA TOUR's new reusable cup policy that took effect at the start of the 2020 season with the goal of delivering more sustainable and environmentally friendly events.

The revised policy allows spectators the opportunity to bring a reusable cup or bottle (plastic or metal) up to 32 ounces on property. Reusable plastic or metal cups/bottles must be empty upon entry and exit.
