Things to Know

- Brian Gay claims fifth PGA TOUR title and his first since 2013
- At age 48, Gay is the oldest winner on TOUR since Davis Love III (2015 Wyndham Championship/51)
- Gay becomes third player in his 40s to win this season (Stewart Cink, Sergio Garcia)
- 47-year-old Stewart Cink moves to No. 2 position in the FedExCup, just four points behind Bryson DeChambeau
- Sponsor exemption Ollie Schniederjans earns fourth career top-3 finish in his 99th start
- Denny McCarthy matches Peter Malnati's first-round 63 for the low round of the week
- 54-hole leader Doc Redman finishes T4 and three back in search of first career PGA TOUR title
- Will Zalatoris becomes eligible for Special Temporary Membership to the PGA TOUR
- Brian Gay wins RSM Birdies Fore Love program with 21 birdies-or-better to earn \$50,000 for charity of his choice

Brian Gay (1st/-15)

- After his T3 finish in last year's Bermuda Championship, posts final-round 64 (-7) en route to fifth PGA TOUR title and first since the 2013 The American Express
- Birdied the final hole of regulation and watched Wyndham Clark par the final hole to tie at 15-under; holed a 15-foot birdie putt at the first hole of sudden death then watched Clark miss for birdie from eight feet
- Claims fifth PGA TOUR title in his 602nd start at 48 years, 10 months, 18 days; becomes the oldest TOUR winner since Davis Love III at 2015 Wyndham Championship (51)
- Collects 500 FedExCup points and moves to No. 9 in the FedExCup standings; earns invitations to the Sentry Tournament of Champions, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament (2021) and PGA Championship
- Hit 34 of 57 fairways to rank No. 4 in Driving Accuracy, 50 of 72 greens in regulation and needed 106 putts for the week
- Projected to move from No. 328 to No. 176 in the Official World Golf Ranking

- Wins RSM Birdies Fore Love program with 21 birdies-or-better to earn \$50,000 for charity of his choice; with nine birdies or better in the final round broke a tie with four other players who also had 21 birdies or better
- Last two TOUR wins have come in playoffs (defeated David Lingmerth and Charles Howell III at the 2013 The American Express)

Wyndham Clark (2nd/-15)

- Making his first appearance at the Bermuda Championship, held the 36-hole lead/co-lead for first time on TOUR
 and led by three strokes on the back nine of the final round, posting 70-65 on the weekend
- Was defeated in his first playoff in his 62nd PGA TOUR start
- Recorded eagles at No. 2 in rounds one and two; marks third event of his PGA TOUR career to make multiple eagles (2020 THE NORTHERN TRUST, 2020 Shriners Hospitals for Children Open)
- Before the Bermuda Championship, owned four top-10s in 61 prior TOUR starts, with all four coming in 2019 (T10/Puerto Rico Open, T7/The Honda Classic, T5/3M Open, T8/THE CJ CUP @ NINE BRIDGES)
- Improves results with each start this season (MC/Safeway Open, 66th/Sanderson Farms Championship, T13/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open, 2nd/Bermuda Championship)

Additional Notes

- Sponsor exemption Ollie Schniederjans (3rd/-13) posts final-round 66 (-5) to claim his fourth top-3 result in 99 TOUR starts; the 2019 Bermuda Championship (MC) was the only PGA TOUR event he played in the 2019-20 season after finishing No. 180 in the FedExCup in the 2018-19 season; top-10 finish earns him an alternate spot at this week's Vivint Houston Open (if he is unsuccessful getting into the field, the exemption carries over to The RSM Classic)
- **Denny McCarthy** (T4/-12) scores a career-best six birdies in a row (Nos. 2-7) en route to a final round 8-under 63, matching Peter Malnati (63/R1) for the low round of the week; joins six other players who have also posted six consecutive birdies in a single round this season (through ZOZO CHAMPIONSHIP)
- Following his win at the season-opening Safeway Open, 47-year-old **Stewart Cink** (T4/-12) was seeking his eighth career TOUR title and second this season; moves to No. 2 in the FedExCup
- Australia's **Matt Jones** (T4/-12) posts first top-5 since T5 at 2020 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am a week ahead of the Vivint Houston Open, which he won in 2014
- 54-hole leader Doc Redman (T4/-12) finishes T4 and three stokes back in search of his first PGA TOUR title
- 36-hole co-leader Ryan Armour (T8/-11) now owns two T8 results at the Bermuda Championship (2019, 2020)
- Kramer Hickok (T8/-11) posts second career top-10 finish in his 52nd start (T10/2019 Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship)
- Will Zalatoris (T16/-8) came into the week with 285 FedExCup points, three points shy of becoming eligible for Special Temporary Membership to the PGA TOUR; with a total of 334 FedExCup non-member points, surpassed the 288 required and can now seek unlimited sponsor exemptions; was seeking his fourth top-10 finish in his fifth start of the season (T6/U.S. Open, T8/Corales Puntacana Resort & Club Championship, T5/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open)
- First-round leader **Peter Malnati** (T21/-7) was seeking a third top-5 finish in as many starts (2nd/Sanderson Farms Championship, T5/Shriners Hospitals for Children Open)
- Making his 650th career PGA TOUR start, 64-year-old Fred Funk (T59/+3) posted a final-round 71 (E)
