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**SEAMUS POWER:** Very pleased how I played. We definitely got the easier part of the day there in the afternoon, but it's still a strong enough wind that your score could get away from you if you lost control of your ball. So, yeah, overall very pleased and hanging in there was the thing today. On some spots on the course it was really blowing, but the greens were much better than I thought. I thought it was going to be very difficult to putt with the strength of the winds. I figured we wouldn't be able to putt or roll them with as fast as the ball's rolling. So overall very pleased, very happy and in a good spot for tomorrow.

**Q. Kind of go back to your -- I know you've been in the United States for a while, but did you kind of go back to your days in Ireland and having to really create shots with the wind?**

**SEAMUS POWER:** Yeah, absolutely. You know, you just get used to playing in the wind, I think. Like you just kind of learn that the wind will move it back and little things like that where you're not always trying to fight it. You see guys who don't play in a lot of wind, you try to overdo in my opinion. Obviously everyone's got their own way of doing it. But it's definitely an advantage, you just kind of learn tricks and kind of what not to do here and there. I was trying to do that as best I could today.

**Q. Is there confidence or advantage that you played here, it's your third time here, especially with not being able to get a round in with the pro-am?**

**SEAMUS POWER:** Yeah, I think it definitely helped because I wasn't on the golf course the last two days. The comfort level of having played it before and kind of knowing what to expect definitely made that easier. I'm sure guys were out, I know Graeme's (inaudible) this morning, guys were out in the afternoon yesterday trying to see it the best they can, so that aspect was nice. I've always felt comfortable here. It's a beautiful place, I have some friends here and just kind of feel at ease, so that always helps in a tournament.
