
Q. It took you a while to make a birdie there, but a great finish for you. It took a while.

GREYSON SIGG: I got off to a good start. I heard you kind of talk on that earlier, the whole group was kind of rolling. It was good to kind of keep your foot down. I played really well all day, I got off to a good start, made a bunch of pars. I looked at my caddie after making nine straight pars on the back nine, I was like, "I shouldn't be as frustrated as I am," but I had a lot of really good looks, wasn't able to make them. It's a funny game, they fall all at the right time. I was able to make four in a row coming in.

Q. Talk to me about fighting the golf ball and the challenges that were there today.

GREYSON SIGG: Yeah, I've been joking with my caddie, makes his job easy because you've got 80 yards and it's like, "Well, what do you like here, a 9-iron or an 8-iron or 7-iron?"

I think like earlier on 12 I want to say I had like 108 yards and I didn't think a 9-iron was going to get there, and I hit 9 and it came up short. So it's just a lot of feel. I've always been a feel player, so I feel like I'm a pretty good wind player and it's just whether or not you get gusts, too. There's a lot of things that go into it, but if you hit good golf shots, you should be rewarded for it.

Q. You had what has to be one of the best shots into 8 today. Tell me about that shot and the birdie you made there.

GREYSON SIGG: I wasn't sure if that ball went in the water or not, we couldn't see it bounce because of the glare off the ocean there. Hit a great shot and the wind never really got it. It was one of those things where the wind died down. We couldn't see it from the tee, but I had a great putt. Getting up there, I wasn't sure if I was going to have to get another ball out or what, but I got up there and it was a 20-footer straight up the hill and I was able to make it.
