BRIAN MORRIS: Why do you ask at such a bad time? Everything. You know what, I'll always have one PGA TOUR start to my name. See my family, friends. Don't know if I ever see them again, you know? It means a lot. It's huge.

Q. When you get a chance to reflect back on the last couple of days, is there a moment or something from these two days of experiences that's going to stand out in your mind?

BRIAN MORRIS: To be honest with you, from the first hole, the initial hole to right now it's been such a ride. Like it's been so many cool people that I haven't met before, and I mean that from people who work for the Tour, people who know events, you know, everybody's just been so cool to me, man. It's been absolutely amazing. I'll never forget this forever.

Q. There are a lot of people around the world that have become fans of you. They want to know what's next in your fight? What are the steps coming up and how are you going to continue fighting this fight?

BRIAN MORRIS: You know what, keep on Monday, just back at it, you know? Back to the hospital on Monday, got my chemo. Just try to live as long as I can.

Q. A message for everybody else that's fighting out there. You got to live your dream this week, it means something to you, but it also means so much to so many other people. What do you want people to see, learn, feel from watching you play 36 holes of dream golf out here with the PGA TOUR?

BRIAN MORRIS: Yeah, just don't give up, man. When things happen this way, all the bad stuff, you know, you just see how much people love you. All those people have been here from day one, they just happen to be in the same place at the same time. It's special, man. There's so much support all over the place. I hope I inspire people, a lot of people, because it's such a rough journey, man. This is the hardest thing. And I'm not talking about golf, I'm talking about this battle. You know, it's the hardest thing ever. To be able to do this is amazing.
