Things to Know

- Ireland's Seamus Power, the highest-ranked player in the field, wins his second PGA TOUR title
- Thomas Detry finishes runner-up and notches third top-15 finish in four starts this season
- PGA TOUR rookie Ben Griffin entered the day T1 alongside Power but carded a 1-over 72 to finish T3
- Patrick Rodgers earns first top-three finish since 2018
- TOUR rookies Griffin (T3), Kevin Yu (T3) and Harrison Endycott (10th) each notch first top-10 finish of the season; Aaron Baddeley posts first top-10 since 2019; all four players earn a start at next week's World Wide Technology Championship at Mayakoba

- Picks up his second PGA TOUR title in his 138th start at the age of 35 years, 7 months, 26 days
- First win on TOUR since 2021 Barbasol Championship where he defeated J.T. Poston in a six-hole playoff
- Secures a one-stroke victory despite four bogeys and two birdies over his final six holes
- Entered the final round tied with Griffin at 18-under; did not secure the outright lead until the par-4 14th
- 28 birdies this week sets a new tournament record, besting Brendan Todd's previous best 27 (2019)
- The only player in tournament history to make three birdies in a single tournament (Rounds 1-3) at the par-3 16th, the signature hole at Port Royal Golf Course
- At No. 48 entering the week, was the only player in the field in the top-50 of the Official World Golf Ranking
- Makes fourth start at Butterfield Bermuda Championship (1st/2022, T12/2021, T37/2020, T31/2019)
- Becomes first 54-hole leader/co-leader to win the Butterfield Bermuda Championship
- One of four players to make the cut in all four editions of the Butterfield Bermuda Championship

Miscellaneous Notes

- Thomas Detry (2nd/-18) birdies the final two holes of the final round to claim his second top-10 of the season and highest finish in 17 starts on TOUR
- PGA TOUR rookie **Ben Griffin** (T3/-17) enters the final round T1 alongside Power; held a two-stroke solo lead after 11 holes before playing the final seven holes 6-over par; in his eighth PGA TOUR start this week, it marks the second top-five finish of his career (4th/2022 Wyndham Championship)
- PGA TOUR rookie **Kevin Yu** (T3/-16) leads the field in eagles this week, making three in the opening round (Nos. 2, 7 and 17); clinches the first top-five finish of his TOUR career in his 14th start
- In his 223rd PGA TOUR start, **Patrick Rodgers** (T3/-18) mixes eight birdies and two bogeys in the final round to finish inside the top-three for the sixth time on TOUR; it marks his best finish since the 2018 RSM Classic
- Aaron Baddeley (T6/-16) shoots a final-round 71 and earns a start at next week's World Wide Technology
 Championship at Mayakoba; Baddeley Monday qualified into Bermuda and recorded his best finish on TOUR since
 a runner-up at the 2019 Puerto Rico Open
- 2020 Butterfield Bermuda Championship winner **Brian Gay** (T11/-13) finishes inside the top-15 for the fourth consecutive year (T11/2022, T12/2021, Won/2020, T3/2019)
- Garrick Higgo (T29/-10) posts a tournament-record 10 birdies in a round en route to a final-round 7-under 64, the low round of the day; he has accomplished the feat twice (R3/2021, R4/2022) and shares the record with Brendon Todd (R4/2019)
- Following his final-round 4-over 75, **Scott Gutschewski** (T59/-4) failed to meet the requirements of his medical extension to continue the rest of the season out of the 126-150 category (2-way T38 or better) and now loses his PGA TOUR membership
- University of Tennessee freshman **Caleb Surratt** (T65/+1) carded a final-round 6-under 65 after posting a 14-over 85 in the third round that included a 12 at the par-4 14th
