
Q. Thomas, nice playing, especially in some very windy conditions today. How would you assess the round?

THOMAS DETRY: Tiring, very tiring. I got off to a slow start, made a good putt for par on the first. Stayed patient, and then I made a nice birdie on the sixth hole and then that really kicked off my day really. It was tough, the back nine is playing tough along the ocean. Some beautiful holes, but it's blowing straight off the west so into the wind. It was a challenge on every putt, every tee shot. It was a commitment out there.

Q. Finishing birdie-birdie, that's going to obviously make things taste a little better going forward here?

THOMAS DETRY: Yeah, I think that'll change up my schedule now. I think that solo third, I'm not sure where I'm at, but I think it will make a big difference now for the next few weeks and few months ahead. So I'm very pleased with the way I finished, that was great. I thought I was in the water on 17, ended up just short, great shot on the green, had a good chance for eagle. And the bunker shot on the last was just the cherry on the cake.

Q. We've talked about this, you're very experienced from the European Tour. We a lot of times think of rookies on the PGA TOUR being rookies, but you're obviously a seasoned veteran of professional golf, but this is going to probably be your best finish I believe probably on the PGA TOUR.

THOMAS DETRY: That's right, yeah.

Q. How much confidence can you take from that going forward here the rest of the fall and then obviously into 2023?

THOMAS DETRY: It's huge, honestly. I knew I was playing well for a while. I've had a caddie change in last May which really changed my attitude and my mindset on the golf course and I've been playing really well since the Scottish Open really. I've been playing some really solid golf. I think a win is just around the corner. Probably not this week, but who knows the next couple of weeks. The confidence is high and hopefully I can keep it going for the next years.

Q. You said it's going to probably change the next few weeks. Are you going to go to Mayakoba next week?

THOMAS DETRY: Correct, I will play Mayakoba and then I'm not sure yet for Houston. I

may come back in Europe. As you know, I'm based in Dubai, so it would be nice for me to play the Race to Dubai, DP World Tour Race to Dubai in November.
