ADAM SCHENK (-12)



Q. Adam, welcome to the interview room. You just mentioned that you hadn't been here for a while. Must feel pretty good to be in here tied for the lead going into the final round.

ADAM SCHENK: Yeah, it does. A great opportunity to have for tomorrow. I know if I don't, I have to go to Q-School if I don't get inside the top 100, so that's a pretty big motivator and what a great opportunity to have tomorrow.

Q. What sort of feelings did you have coming into this week given the position you were in and just with two events left? What did you feel?

ADAM SCHENK: I've been playing a lot better golf. I've been working pretty darn hard at it the last four months -- well, the last two years, but not a lot of results. But kind of found something about two or three months ago. After Wyndham I started to make a few changes and really started to see some improvements after that.

I wish I really could have done this earlier in the season because I wouldn't be in this position, but here we are. And if I can make some putts tomorrow, it's hard to do in the wind, maybe play another bogey-free round, that'd be awesome, that puts me in a really good spot.

Q. Yeah, bogey free. What was the key to your round today? You did a lot of things well you just said, but what do you think you excelled at?

ADAM SCHENK: Made a few par putts. Made a nice par putt on 8, six-footer. Six-footer on 9. Then hit a pretty poor drive on 18 and got behind some trees but lofted an 8-iron over it and had a nice flyer lie that I could take the spin off the golf ball and be able to play an 8-iron from 155. If I would have been in the fairway from 155, it would have been a 6-iron, maybe thinking about 5. That was very fortunate to be able to get that ball on the green. I really wish I could have made that last putt, but I would have taken 4 no questions asked from where I was.

Q. Pretty wicked winds all day. How do you describe the day given those conditions and have you seen anything like that in the past?

ADAM SCHENK: Laughable at times. I played, gosh, Exuma in the Bahamas, the one windy, windy year, maybe the first year we were there. It was really comparable to that. Thursday morning was super windy as well. Friday was really manageable, 15 to 20, but today was blowing the entire time. It was probably fortunate to start on the front side



because the wind had calmed down a little bit. I can't imagine how long 16 and 15 were playing earlier this morning, earlier this afternoon.

Q. Speaking of 16, 15, you did the walk-and-talk today with Craig Perks of the Golf Channel on 15. He talked about your putting and we've seen it on TV, it's a little different, not many people do what you do. Can you just kind of elaborate on that a little bit?

ADAM SCHENK: I could talk about it for hours. I should write down all my putting thoughts so I could look back at them in 10 years and laugh at myself.

Just been putting mostly one handed. This week, today it was too windy at times when the wind was -- when we were protected from the wind I could use one hand and hit a lot of nice putts. Had a couple lip-outs. I don't think I made any today with one hand, but I would put the left hand just barely on top so it was basically like putting right-handed.

Made a nice putt on -- two par putts on 8 and 9 and then 10 and 11 were bonuses, hit a great putt on 12, didn't go in, and then made a bonus putt from really far away on 13.

Q. You've had a couple of runner-up finishes in your career out here on Tour, one of them was a playoff I remember at Charles Schwab Challenge.

What do you think your emotions will be like tonight and going into tomorrow seeking that first victory?

ADAM SCHENK: It will be fine. I mean, I'll be really excited for tomorrow. I'll still sleep well. It's tiring after today, so I'll still sleep well. I'll definitely be, I don't want to call it nervous, more excited than anything for tomorrow just to have the opportunity and find out what's going to happen. So I'm as excited to see what's going to happen as everybody else is.
